Alleged misconduct puts IHS officials in hot seat

WASHINGTON Senators lambasted Indian Health Service officials Tuesday after investigators found that some workers in the federal agency had criminal records, stole drugs and embezzled money - all while patients endured long lines for medical services or were

turned away. Government inspectors have opened almost 300 investigations into IHS during the past decade for alleged violations including fraud, theft and employee misconduct, according to the

inspector general of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

At the same time, IHS supervisors often put disciplined employees on paid administrative leave, allowing them to stay at home and collect their salary for months.

Tuesday's hearing by the Indian Senate Affairs Committee focused on IHS' Aberdeen office, which includes 48 medical facilities in South Dakota, North Dakota, Iowa and Nebraska.

Committee Chairman Byron Dorgan, D-N.D., said his staff found numerous examples of mismanagement

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Oklahoma tribes receive EPA monetary awards

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — Five American Indian tribes in Oklahoma have received monetary awards totaling \$720,000 from the

Environmental Protection Agency. The Miami, Modoc and Seneca-Cayuga tribes and the Wyandotte Nation each have received \$120,000. The EPA says the tribes will use the money to help implement tribal-wide recycling programs, develop tribal indoor air and education and outreach programs, update environmental codes and ordinances and train staff on environmental protec-

The Seneca-Cayuga tribe also will use the money for implementing solid waste cleanup activities, conducting baseline monitoring for indoor air contaminants and developing emergency management

The EPA has given the Cherokee Nation \$240,000. Officials say the tribe will use the money to conduct its annual inter-tribal environmental council conference and assist other tribes in developing customized tribal water quality data templates.

The proposed modification will consist of increasing the facility's crude oil loading capacity from 450 bbl/day to 9600 bbl/day, which results in an increase in

Total air pollutant emissions to the atmosphere are estimated to be approximately 41 tons per year of Organic Compounds (VOC). These emission estimates could change slightly during the course of the Department's review of the application.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. The preliminary review indicates that the facility's air emissions will be in compliance with state and federal air regulations

Based on the applicant's analysis, a preliminary determination is that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 3, 72, Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality permit on or before December 24, 2010. This source is a minor source according to 20.2.74 NMAC, PSD.

To ensure compliance with state and federal air regulations, the permit is expected to include conditions that require vapor balancing and conditions that will require record keeping and reporting to the Department.
