'Hi, grandma!' Toddlers latching onto iPhones

to watch "Mickey Mouse Clubhouse" on TV.)

Hotz, a veteran of such standoffs, switched instantly to what she called her "guaranteed success tool."

"What about Mickey on the phone?" she suggested.

That's all it took. Mother swept up the now entirely cooperative toddler, cued up the show (via YouTube) on her little iPhone screen, and strapped him into her car, where he sang happily along with the video for the 15-minute ride to day care.

Then trouble began again. Brady wanted to stay in his seat with the iPhone. Finally he put it in his coat pocket and went inside — where Hotz was able to surreptitiously reclaim her gizmo and leave for work. But it's not always that easy. "Sometimes I'll need it because someone is calling, and he is not at all willing to give it up," she said.

Apple, the iPhone's designer and manufacturer, has built its success on machines so simple and intuitive that even technologically befuddled adults can figure out how to work them, so it makes sense that sophisticated children would follow. The most recent model is 4.5 inches tall, 2.31 inches wide and weighs 4.8 ounces: sleek, but not too small for those with developing motor skills. Tap a picture on the screen and something happens. What could be more fun?

The sleepy-eyed toddler who called for the iPhone from his crib is one of hundreds of iPhone-loving tykes starring in videos posted throughout the Internet, usually narrated by parents expressing proud wonderment at their offspring's ability to slide chubby fingers across the gadget's screen and pull up photographs and apps of their choice.

Many iPhone apps on the market are aimed directly at preschoolers, many of them labeled "educational," such as *Toddler Teasers: Shapes*, which asks the child to tap a circle or square or triangle; and *Pocket Zoo*, which streams live video of animals at zoos around the world. There are "flash cards" aimed at teaching children to read and spell, and a "Wheels on the Bus" app that sings the popular song in multiple languages.

Then there's the new *iGo Potty app* (sponsored by Kimberly-Clark,

maker of Huggies training pants), with automated phone calls reminding toddlers that it's time to "go."

Hey, that's me up on the screen

more than \$50 million at the box office.

The opening scenes of "The Social Network," in which Mark Zuckerberg's character embarks on a manic marathon coding session with his friends, rang eerily true to 23-year-old Jared Hecht. That's because he lived thorough it — although not at Harvard and not in 2003.

Hecht is one of the creators of a group text-messaging application called GroupMe, released in late August after a similar all-night affair.

"We literally stayed up for 24 hours, fueled by Red Bull and pizza, to create our company," he said. "So seeing the scene where Mark creates Facemash" — Facebook's predecessor — "was like, 'Wow, we've been through that before.'"

For the newest class of entrepreneurs developing the next generation of Web-based companies, "The Social Network" is the first time many have seen their startup culture splashed on the big screen. Much as "All the President's Men" and "Wall Street" (the original and definitely not the remake) became obsessive movie-going experiences for young journalists and budding Masters of the Universe, the film has become a cultural touchstone for people in the tech world, who finally see on screen a world they recognize as their own.

"Startups have been around since 1939," said Chris Wiggins, an associate professor of applied mathematics at Columbia who runs a group called HackNY that matches computer science students with internships at startups, among other things. "I can't recall a film like this about one before."

Jay Lorenz, a former American studies professor at Georgetown University, said that films revolving around the lives of geeks using the Internet rarely make it beyond cult status. Typically, he said, the subject has been "a box-office bust."

But, he added, the "cultural phenomenon" of Facebook was such that it probably helped the movie move past niche appeal. In its first two weeks, "The Social Network" pulled in

Amanda Peyton, 26, a creator of an app called MessageParty, said the film perfectly "hit on the founder mentality." Added Peyton: "You don't do anything else. You wake up in the morning, go to your computer, work until you pass out."

Peyton caught the film with her co-founder, Jason Gavris, 23, after a long Sunday spent redesigning their application. "Over the summer we lived down the street from the Facebook offices, and our house was pretty much like that — minus the drugs and girls," she added with a laugh.

Among the digerati, picking apart fact from fiction and debating the fairness of Zuckerberg's acerbic portrayal have saturated sites like Twitter, Tumblr and Facebook, and nearly worn out their welcome as conversation starters tossed out over beers at the end of a tiring day.

Alexa Hirschfeld, 26, who runs the online invitation site Paperless Post, stood in line to see the movie on opening night along with two other founders, Mike Hudack, of the online video site Blip.tv, and Sam Lessin, of Drop.io, a private file-sharing service.

Afterward, she said, "I called my brother, who is my co-founder, and we laughed about the lines, the Hollywoodized parts."

"I even tweeted some of those Winklevii lines," she added, referring to Tyler and Cameron Winklevoss, twins who contend that Zuckerberg stole the Facebook idea from them.

The movie hit especially close to home for Hirschfeld because she was part of the same 2006 class at Harvard as Zuckerberg — before he dropped out. "I used to joke that I hadn't even put my book bag down and the guy had made \$150 million," she said.

"The most interesting part was hearing people talk about the tech industry on the way out after the movie," she said. "It's a real-world mirroring of what's happening online in the last few years, how much Facebook has become part of the conversation."
