Writer Maya Angelou sings about her love of books

NEW YORK — In her low husky voice, Maya Angelou came out singing an old African-American song about a rainbow to express her love of books and libraries.

"God put the rainbow in the clouds ... so the viewer can see the possibility of hope. That's what a library is," said the 82-year-old poet, author, and dramatist as she finished the song based on Genesis.

Friday's occasion marked the official announcement by the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture in Harlem of its acquisition of some 340 boxes of her personal papers. The center is part of the New York Public Library.

The 6-foot-tall author of "I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings" walked with difficulty on stage. But once seated, she regaled the audience with reminiscences of her Arkansas childhood and friendships with such 20th century powerhouses as novelist James Baldwin and civil rights activist Malcolm X.

Angelou said she was 8 years old and a "voluntary mute" after she was raped at age 7 when a teacher at her all-black school showed her the library and said, "I want you to read every book in this room." She did — all 200-300 of them.

"No bad can happen to you in the library. You can't be raped or mugged in a library. You can't be talked down to, belittled, humiliated in the library," she said. "As soon as I'm in a library, I'm OK."

The first time she entered the grand New York Public Library on Fifth Avenue with its sweeping staircase and rooms where she could "read what happened in China in the 4th century," she was bowled over, she told The Associated Press in an interview earlier this week.

"It still makes me weak in the knees to think that I can go into any library in the world and nobody can keep me out," she told the AP.

The decision to house her papers at the Schomburg — the world's largest repository of material on people of African descent — was "so easy," said Angelou, who's donated other material there over the years, including a collection of letters from Booker T. Washington and Frederick Douglass.

As the Schomburg's national membership chair, she's raised \$7 million, said library Director Howard Dodson.

Angelou recalled for the audience how the books at her Arkansas elementary school, which were donated by whites, were often coverless and tattered. But by the time she and her classmates were done with them, decorating them with cotton and pretty cloth, "the books were so beautiful," she said.

She recounted how an English friend whose father was a famous Communist and friend of Paul Robeson gave her tapes of the actor-singer in concert supposedly in Hungary, knowing how much she loved African-Americana.

Angelou said she couldn't get anyone in her home state of North Carolina to transfer the tapes into film so she turned to Dodson. It was Dodson, she said, who discovered that the concert was not in Hungary at all but taped at a church in New Jersey after Robeson's passport was revoked for his political views in the 1950s. The tapes were then smuggled out of the country, she said.

Angelou also recalled an incident involving Baldwin.

In her famous storytelling style, she said the "Native Son" author, who was all of 5-foot-5-inches "in wedges," came to her rescue after taking her to "a joint" that reeked of "Lysol and urine." He had briefly left her alone at the bar and returned to find a burly man pestering her.

She said Baldwin came right in between her and the man and said: "You've been taking care of her for me? You're dismissed now," and then added an expletive that Angelou repeated for the audience, which roared with laughter.

Angelou has been nominated for a Pulitzer Prize for her "Give Me A Cool Drink of Water 'fore I Diie," written 31 books and penned a poem for Bill Clinton's 1993 inauguration. Her newest book, out in December, is "Good Food, All Day Long: Cook Splendidly, East Smart," a cookbook filled with autobiographical sketches of how the recipes came to be.

In the interview with the AP from her home in Winston-Salem, N.C., she said selecting the most relevant papers from her private collection was "a little like who's the most important of your children."

But she's glad to be parting with the material. "Friends of mine are dying with such rapidity that it's heart breaking," she said. "I said, 'Let me take care of this now 'cause you can't look around the corner.' I hope it's not a signal that I'm about to leave, but in case I am, I want my papers at the Schomburg."

'SAW 3D': Ending a lethal game and all its gory detail

The people behind the "Saw" movies have made us a promise: no more "Saw" movies.

Before they pack up the bear traps and latex flesh, though, they've left us a digestif: "Saw 3D," the seventh and presumably last film in the series.

The "Saw" franchise has always produced meretricious garbage, with a claim to moral complexity that serves as a fig leaf while we enjoy the sight of limbs being hacked off and heads exploding. (The standard reaction in theaters to these payoff scenes is laughter and cheers.)

The one distinctive thing about the films has been their Dadaist quality, brought about by a concentration on elaborate, self-referential game-playing at

the expense of story and logic.

Kevin Greutert's "Saw 3D," focused on tying up loose ends and bringing the tale full circle, is probably the most straightforward of the seven films and most consistently (though not inventively) violent.

Sean Patrick Flanery, new to the series, plays this episode's designated hypocrite, whose sin is pretending to be a victim of the serial torturer and killer Jigsaw to profit from the connection.

He is sent on the traditional race against time, trying to save a series of people from flesh-rending machines by inflicting pain on himself, in a ritual that recalls the levels of a video game or the Stations of the Cross.

Meanwhile, the "Saw" meta-narrative works itself out, helped by the usual copious flashbacks, and nearly everyone ends up

dead or chained to a toilet.

Costas Mandylor is back as Hoffman, who took over the primary punishment duties from Jigsaw around "Saw V," and the genre queen Betsy Russell makes her fifth appearance as Jigsaw's former wife.

Tobin Bell gets to play Jigsaw for the seventh time, even though his character died in "Saw III," and to really make it old bloody home week, Cary Elwes returns as Doctor Gordon, the guy who got things started back in 2004 by sawing off his own foot.

Be aware: If you see the film in a theater equipped with RealD 3D and Dolby sound, you'll come away with a pretty good idea of what it would feel like to have flying body parts hit you in the face.

New prison term for LA terror plot cooperater

NEW YORK — After helping prosecutors convict two co-conspirators in a terrorist plot to blow up Los Angeles International Airport, Abdel Ghani Meskini got a short sentence and a new start as a manager of a run-down Atlanta apartment complex.

But Meskini was sent back to prison Friday for nearly three more years after a judge found he broke release rules by having a handgun and trying to get an AK-47 assault rifle.

The story of Meskini's downfall, told at a hearing earlier this month, provided an unusual look at a turncoat terrorist who tried to rebuild his life — all the more unusual because it was told partly by a prostitute who said he'd helped her cope.

Meskini, 42, thanked his lawyer but otherwise said nothing before U.S. District Judge John F. Keenan sentenced him to 31 months in federal prison. Defense lawyer Mark DeMarco suggested Meskini had been led astray by his surroundings in the crime-riddled complex — a job the judge had faulted federal probation officers for letting Meskini take.

"He was put in a position where the influences around him, perhaps, led him to this conduct," DeMarco said. "Which is no excuse, but had he been placed into a job with law-abiding people, perhaps this wouldn't have happened."

Meskini, an Algerian who came to the U.S. as a stowaway on a boat in 1994, made tens of thousands of dollars in bank fraud and credit card schemes before becoming involved in the so-called millennium plot to bomb the busy Los Angeles airport on New Year's Eve in 1999. The plot was thwarted when now-convicted co-conspirator Ahmed Ressam was caught trying to cross into Washington state from Canada in an explosives-laden vehicle in December 1999.

Meskini pleaded guilty in March 2001 to eight charges, including conspiring to provide material support to terrorists. He testified against Ressam and Mokhtar Haouari, both now convicted and serving prison sentences.

Credited for his cooperation with investigators, Meskini was sentenced to six years in prison, less than half the term set out in sentencing guidelines.

He was freed in 2005 under probation terms that barred him from having firearms, among other conditions.

The U.S. Probation Department accused Meskini last March of violating those terms in various ways, including the handgun and assault-rifle allegations and a claim that he was associating with criminals.

Indeed, he did — and thank goodness, an admitted prostitute named Crystal Roughton told the court earlier this month. She was given immunity for discussing her own crimes.

The purpose of the Commission is to ensure that the water rights of the Navajo Nation are vigorously pursued, effectively coordinated and to enhance the communication between all entities engaged in water rights efforts on behalf of the Navajo Nation.

Candidates with general understanding of water resource developments and issues including the means of securing wet water rights. Ability to speak Navajo is preferred.
