

# NM tribe bans newspaper after story of horrific killing

ALBUQUERQUE — Exercising its rights as a sovereign nation, a small Indian community has banned the local newspaper from its reservation for publishing details about the horrific killing of a member of the tribe.

Elsewhere, such a move would have prompted a debate on freedom of speech.

But in the remote town nestled in northern New Mexico's mesas and red rocks, the ban is an example of press freedoms long accepted throughout the U.S. running up against tribal sovereignty.

The leaders of the Jemez Pueblo were horrified by the seven-paragraph story in the Jemez Thunder newspaper that recounted the killing: a tribal member stabbed, slashed and disemboweled another man.

Already reeling from the killing, the tribe banned the paper from being sold on its land.

Robert Borden, who has published the newspaper since 1995, said he was disheartened rather than angry. The community "is hurt by the fact that this occurred at all," he said. "I didn't hurt the community.

The tribe was well within its rights as a sovereign government to prohibit, as the governor did, the distribution of the newspaper at the tribal visitor's center and a convenience store.

The pueblos enjoy sovereign immunity where free speech and the First Amendment are concerned," said Peter Simonson, executive director of the American Civil Liberties Union in New Mexico.

The tribe was in the news just a week ago, when it banned trick-or-treating on Halloween. The tribe said it was not part of its traditional culture and was a safety concern because of the small community's unlit

The tribe of about 2,500 sits an hour's drive northwest of Albuquerque, New Mexico's largest city. The deeply community embraces its traditions, including preserving their Towa language.

Tribal lands are apart from the U.S. government. Tribes have their own separate governments, and their own laws. The federal government prosecutes violations of crimes such as mur-

The 1,000-circulation, English-language newspaper is based in the nearby non-tribal community of Jemez Springs, sells for 75 cents and usually runs between 24 to 32 pages, said Borden, who owns it along with his wife, Kathleen Wiegner.

about the pueblo in the past. He wrote the story about the killing based on an FBI criminal complaint filed in federal court. He noted he also wrote that the defendant is presumed innocent until proven guilty.

It was published at the bottom of the front page of the paper's Oct. 15 edition, below stories about a horseriding program and artists being sought for a bridge program.

Lucas Toledo, 22, faces a murder charge in the killing of Matthew Panana, 21, on Sept. 29.

Jemez Pueblo Gov. Joshua Madalena banned the sales, saying the story sensationalized. Madalena said the paper's failure to exercise restraint shows it is "out of touch with the community's perspective."

Madalena said Tuesday the close-knit community did not need to know the details of the killings. He said the story reopened wounds and was hurtful to

Both men were planning to meet Wednesday for what Borden said would be "a wide-ranging discussion."

Madalena said the discussion needs to be held "to make sure the newspaper is respectful toward the pueblo and the other communities" reporter make up the staff, in the 30-mile Jemez Valley.

# Tribe fights giant solar energy project

SAN DIEGO — The Quechan Tribe claims the Secretary of the Interior rushed through approval of a giant solar power project in the Mojave Desert and ignored potential damage to the tribe's cultural artifacts and the desert's sensitive flora and fauna, including an endangered lizard that appears in the tribe's creation story.

The 709-megawatt Imperial Valley Solar Project will spread 28,360 "SunCatcher" dishes across 6,360 acres of public land, about 14 miles west of El Centro.

The Department of the Interior approved Tessera Solar's proposal in an Oct. 13 Record of Decision (ROD).

The public lands that are the subject of the Imperial Valley ROD are within the traditional territory of the Quechan Indian Tribe and contain cultural and biological resources of significance to the tribe, its government, and its members," the tribe says in its federal complaint.

The tribe and its members also have an interest in preserving the quality of the land, water, air, fauna, and flora within the tribe's traditional territory, within and outside the reservation. Specifically, the tribe is concerned with impacts to the habitat of Flat Tailed Horned lizards on lands proposed for development, as the lizard is a central part of

the tribe's creation story." In making its "fast-track" decision, the Secretary of the Interior and others omitted reviews required by the National Environmental Policy Act, the Endangered Species

Act, the National Historic Preservation Act,

the Federal Land Policy Management Act and other laws, the tribe says.

"Interior arbitrarily placed the IVS Project on an artificial 'fast-track' in order to achieve the applicant's goal of obtaining millions of dollars of federally available financing that purportedly required project approval prior to the end of 2010," the tribe says.

"Despite Interior and the applicant's efforts to 'fast-track' the review of the IVS Project, Congress did not waive or limit the applicability of any federal laws or regulations related to compliance with NEPA, the NHPA, FLPMA, or other laws with regard to the IVS Project. Full compliance with applicable federal laws is mandatory."

Tessera Solar will buy 6,600 acres of flattail horned lizard habitat to offset land lost to new roads, structures and traffic through the desert, the Bureau of Land Management said in announcing the project, one of the first solar energy developments to be approved on

The Quechans, a Yuman-speaking people, have lived in the Mojave Desert for "thousands of years," during which they and their 'tribal ancestors traditionally occupied, traveled, traded, and utilized resources within a broad geographical area located within the desert lands of modern-day [western] Arizona and Southern California," according to the complaint. Today the tribe has about

3,500 members. The tribe's 45,000-acre reservation sprawls across the Mojave Desert around Interstate 8, and to the south borders on Baja California, Mexico. The area has long been identified as a prime location to develop utility-grade solar energy projects.
