

# Linda Warner out as Haskell president; leader to be sought

LAWRENCE, Kan. — The federal government soon will be looking for a new president to lead Haskell Indian Nations University.

Linda Warner, who started work as Haskell president in April 2007, has accepted another job with the Bureau of Indian Education and, therefore, no longer is the school's president, said Larry Echo Hawk, U.S. assistant secretary for Indian affairs.

Warner had been Haskell president in name only since September 2009, when she had been detailed off campus to perform accreditation work at another federal school for American Indians: Southwestern Indian Polytechnic Institute in Albuquerque, N.M.

In January, the government sent her to a regional Bureau of Indian Education office in Oklahoma City, and she has not set foot on the Haskell campus since her depar-

"I want to acknowledge and thank Dr. Warner for her contributions to the BIE, and in particular, Haskell Indian Nations University," Echo Hawk said, in a letter.

Officials never disclosed their reasons for sending Warner off campus, although she had clashed with some faculty and staff on campus over work rules and plans to launch additional programs.

Members of Haskell's Board of Regents twice cast votes of "no confidence" in Warner — once before her departure from campus, and again in May — in an continued effort to have her removed from campus. Regents said Warner didn't properly communicate dates.

with regents, filed reports "usurping the authority" of regents, and did not follow a previous agreethat outlined ment responsibilities for the regents.

The divisiveness on the Haskell campus drew criticism and concern from U.S. Sen. Pat Roberts, R-Kan., and others in the Kansas Congressional delegation, who eight months ago formally urged the Department of Interior to address leadership concerns at Haskell.

Echo Hawk's letter, posted Monday, included an update regarding his own visit to campus during the spring. "While my visit was in

the midst of challenging circumstances, I was nonetheless encouraged and inspired by the commitment, dedication and perseverance of the stuadministration, faculty and staff of the university," Echo Hawk said. "Haskell has faced many challenges throughout its 126-year history, and it has met those challenges head on, overcomadversity and strengthening itself in the process. ... One thing remains the same — the perseverance of Haskell that will lead to a brighter future."

Chris Redman, an education specialist from the bureau's Oklahoma City office, remains Haskell's interim president. His latest term as interim president was to end this week, but Echo Hawk extended the term while the government prepares to lead a search for Warn-

er's successor. Leading the search will be Keith Moore, who started June 1 as director of the Bureau of Indian Education. A committee will conduct a national search for candi-

# Tribal PACs give nearly \$1.2 million in 2010 election

MINNESOTA — The 2010 Minnesota election is one that will undeniably be marked by the influence of third-party groups, which have put down millions of dollars - some more than any of the governor candidates - to influence the outcome.

In addition to the more than \$5 million funneled into DFL candidate coffers via labor-backed group Alliance for a Better Minnesota, tribal political action committees have put nearly \$1.2 million into mostly DFL hands so far this year.

According to campaign finance reports, nine tribal PACs have donated about \$1,172,000 to candidates and political funds - mostly in the Legislature - by mid October. The largest sums came from the Prairie Island Indian Community, the Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux and the Mille Lacs Ojibwe

Most of the cash has gone to the House and Senate DFL caucuses, with more than \$350,000 going to the Senate DFL and about \$397,000 to House Democrats. Republicans recieved paltry sums from the groups in comparison, with the House Republican Campaign Committee taking in about \$33,000, and the Republican's Senate Victory Fund getting about \$14,500 from tribe-affiliated groups.

The groups gave large donations to House Speaker Margaret Anderson Kelliher before she lost in the primary election, giving her bid a total of \$15,000. The tribes even threw \$2,000 the way of DFL gubernatorial primary candidate Matt Entenza.

DFL gubernatorial nominee Mark Dayton has only received a single \$1,000 contribution from tribal groups, while GOP nominee Tom Emmer received \$1,250 from tribes total. Independence Party candidate Tom Horner recieved no tribal con-

tributions Both Horner and Dayton have said they are for expanding gaming in the state to help plug the \$6 billion deficit, while Emmer has been more ambiguous about his position. The groups are on par with their contributions during the last gubernatorial election in 2006, having donated about \$1,236,000 total during the contest.

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
