## Navajo legal case brings out ownership disputes

SHIPROCK — Construction remains stalled on the Shiprock Home for Women and Children following a hearing Tuesday in Shiprock District Court.

Judge Genevieve Woody extended a temporary restraining order after hearing arguments from a Navajo Nation attorney, who sought the original restraining order on the construction site, and an attorney representing both the domestic violence home and RJN Construction, of Mancos, Colo.

The restraining order, which prohibits construction crews or shelter staff from trespassing on the property, will be in effect until the court makes a final ruling, Woody said. Legal briefs from both the plaintiff and the defendants are due Thursday, and oral arguments are expected to be heard mid-month.

Yet every day that passes jeopardizes the project. Funds topping \$1.4 million from the state of New Mexico may be retracted if the project is not started this month, said attorney Brian Lewis, who is representing the Navajo Nation.

"The project must be started by the third or fourth week of December to use the money by May," he said. The grant money, allocated through a Joint Powers Agreement between the state and the tribe, may be retracted at the end of the fiscal year if the project is not completed.

The question on which Woody must rule is which entity is the rightful owner of the property, located about a mile north of the Northern Navajo Medical Center.

The shelter itself claims ownership under a lease with the Nation. The construction firm also claims temporary ownership under a business contract. Yet the Navajo Nation contends it is the "true and legal owner" of the property, and therefore has authorization to access the property and to rescind business contracts to search for a new construction firm to finish the project.

When completed, the \$6 million shelter will house 14 adults and 84 children who need refuge from domestic violence situations, shelter CEO Gloria Champion said.

The former shelter was demolished seven years ago when a contract first was awarded to RJN Construction. Domestic violence victims have sought asylum in a temporary complex where quarters are cramped and much of the furniture and other operating materials are in storage, Champion said. Funds were awarded to

the project in 2002, and a year later the Nation selected RJN Construction during a competitive bid process. Because of fluctuating steel prices and the company's reliance on grant money, however, the project has stalled several times.

The most recent obstacle came during the summer when the Navajo Housing Authority and the Navajo Attorney General alleged RJN violated Navajo code by securing a sole-source contract. The Navajo Housing Authority on Aug. 31 suspended the project with only 20 percent left incomplete.

The Navajo Tribal Council twice this fall debated and voted down proposed legislation that would have waived sovereign immunity to extend the contract. The Council instead gave direction to Nation staff to select a new firm for completion of the project.

Lewis argued Tuesday that the Nation cannot legally extend the contract and that the issue of the contract is not under the jurisdiction of the Shiprock District Court. "There is only one issue that is relevant today," he said. "That is the issue of ownership and possession. The contract is not relevant ... the court lacks subject jurisdiction."

Lewis also argued that the Nation is "the only one

of the three entities that has control of this trust land." The shelter has a lease to operate the facility and the construction company has a lease to do work on the property, but neither has ownership rights, Lewis said.

Further, the Nation has paid for the project in full, including an extra \$99,000 awarded in 2008, Lewis said, alleging RJN consciously left the project unfinished to continue to collect money.

"This contract is closed," he said. The Nation "paid not only the entirety of the agreed-upon contract," but an additional \$99,000.

James Zion, an Albuquerque-based attorney representing RJN and the home, began his arguments by raising three questions. He asked the court whether a lease has meaning on the Navajo Nation, whether business contracts have meaning and whether the Nation is a "safe place to do business."

"We have very different views of what this case is all about," Zion said of himself and the plaintiff. He argued that a contract gives an entity "real ownership," or temporary control of the property under a lease.

Zion read from copies of the original lease, a March lease modification and a May lease amendment, all of which state RJN will

transfer the property back to the Nation until it has completed construction on the five complexes comprising the shelter.

"The contract is open-ended, meaning until everything is done," he said. "Both the home and RJN have existing contractual rights that cannot be touched by the Navajo Nation."

Woody on Tuesday allowed Robert Nelson, CEO of RJN Construction, to enter the property to retrieve personal tools or equipment. Nelson is being sued as an individual, as well as part of his construction company.

As the entities continue to haggle in court, subcontractors still are waiting to be paid for materials and labor. Winston Cole, owner of Cold Steel, Inc., in Farmington, said RJN owes his company more than \$58,000 for steel fabrication and erection completed in March 2007.

"I have made several attempts to collect from RJN and have had no success due to the fact that they have no money to complete the project," Cole said. "Cold Steel has paid all employees and has also paid for all the materials used on this job and would like to be paid for our services. Now that the Navajo Nation wants to take this project

from RJN, that leaves us with the question as to what happens to all the subcontractors like myself who (are) still owed money on this job."
